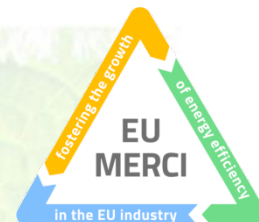

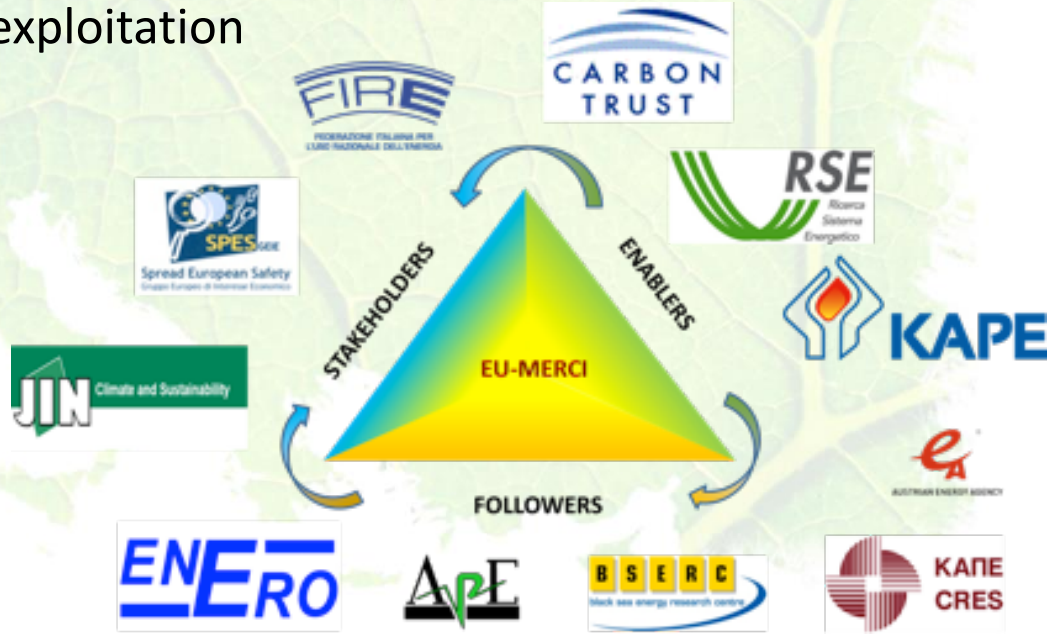

- To share of experiences on the implementation of polices, schemes and mechanisms to support their exploitation

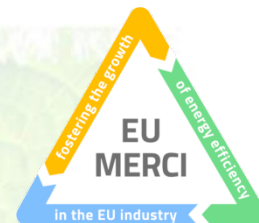

• Objective of the Webinar A

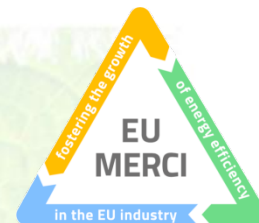

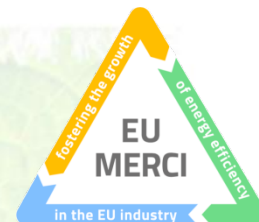

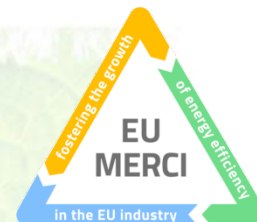
